
Sealed proposals addressed to Lamb County, Texas will be received at Parkhill, Smith & Cooper Inc., (PSC) 4222 85th Street, Lubbock, Texas 79423 until Wednesday, August 23, 2017 at 2 p.m. CDT for Denim Road Reconstruction Project, EDA #08-01-05131, Lamb County, Texas. Work will include reconstruction of approximately 4,400 linear feet of roadway and associated earthwork and minor drainage work.

Immediately following closing time for receipt of bids, proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud at PSC. Any bid received after closing time will be returned unopened. Bids will be tabulated and presented to Lamb County staff for action at a later date.

A prebid conference will be held Tuesday, August 1, 2017 in the Continental Dairy Conference Room, 1926 FM 54, Littlefield, Texas at 10 a.m. CDT. Attendance by prospective Bidders is not mandatory, but highly encouraged.

Deposit shall be Company check or cashiers' check made payable to Parkhill, Smith & Cooper, Inc. No partial sets will be issued. Shipping is available for an additional fee.

A bid bond in the amount of 5 percent of the bid issued by an acceptable surety shall be submitted with each bid [for those contracts that exceed \$100,000]. A certified check or bank draft payable to Lamb County or negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (as par value) may be submitted in lieu of the Bid Bond.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than, the federally determined prevailing (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts) wage rate, as issued by the Texas Department of Agriculture Office of Rural Affairs and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project. In addition, the successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual identity, gender identity, or national origin.

Lamb County reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities in the bidding.

Bids may be held by Lamb County for a period not to exceed 30 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and investigating the bidder's qualifications prior to the contract award.
