WHEREAS, Lamb County has created a county-wide Hazard Mitigation Plan for itself and its participants which is in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, Lamb County, Texas Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan identifies mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in the plan from impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS, adoption by the Commissioner's Court demonstrates our commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Plan; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of this plan will make Lamb County eligible to apply for current open and future Hazard Mitigation Grants; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF LAMB COUNTY:

Section 1. That Lamb County adopt the FEMA approved Lamb and Lynn Counties and Participating Jurisdictions Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan.
